#### 7.1 King's Birthday Honours List - Jeanette Lockey OAM

#### Cr Tom Sharp:

"We acknowledge the contribution of Tamborine Mountain resident, Jeanette Lockey, whose service to the Tamborine Mountain community over many decades was recognised in the King's Birthday Honours List this month.

Jeanette has been a strong advocate for Tamborine Mountain and the wider Scenic Rim, since moving to this region in the 1980s, and has been honoured with an Order of Australia medal for her work with numerous community groups.

One of the earliest with which she was associated was the Tamborine Mountain Garden Club, which went on to establish the Tamborine Mountain Botanic Gardens that opened in December 1988 and which has grown to become a jewel in the crown of the region.

Thanks to the efforts of garden club members such as Jeanette, and other volunteers, this much loved community space has become a drawcard for our region and the backdrop for countless weddings and special occasions.

Keen to preserve Tamborine Mountain's lifestyle and natural values, Jeanette joined the Tamborine Mountain Progress Association in which she held numerous positions as Treasurer, Secretary and President from the early 1990s onwards until 2023.

In these roles, and as a private citizen, Jeanette has been a staunch campaigner against inappropriate development and commercial water harvesting from Tamborine Mountain to protect the unique fauna and flora of the Mountain plateau.

Jeanette has continued this advocacy for the Mountain and its residents as President of the Tamborine Mountain Preservation Association.

She has served on a number of community committees, including the South East Queensland Development Forum and, in addition to her membership of the garden club, is also an active member of the local tennis club.

Jeanette is very well respected and loved within her community for her strength of character and willingness to help others and is well worthy of the honour that has been bestowed upon her.
