- 1. Council note the legal advice and update provided on a confidential investigation;
- 2. Council will review the investigation reports in their entirety and will make a decision on the matter at a future Ordinary Meeting; and
- 3. Council is satisfied that the current mitigation strategy in place protects the relevant parties from the risks associated with this process.
