5.1 Question from Mr Nigel Waistell re 126 Long Road, Tamborine Mountain, Lot 7 SP341940

Question from Mr Nigel Waistell:

"126 Long Road, Tamborine Mountain, Lot 7 SP341940 is Council land and earmarked for a car park to service Gallery Walk. Under amendment 8 to the Planning scheme, 126 Long Road is also being considered as a potential site for retirement homes and a retirement facility. Please can Council explain how you can have a Council car park and a private centre for retirement homes and a retirement facility on the same title?"

Response

Chief Executive Officer:

"I can confirm that the car park and other Council facilities planned for this site will occupy only a small portion of the land.

Due to the limited availability of large lots and adjacent commercial areas this site still remains a possibility for a retirement facility from a planning perspective. It should be noted however, that while Council's planning documents have identified it as potentially suitable for a retirement facility, Council has not planned any future use of this site beyond the public toilets and a car park.

Operating multiple uses from a single property is totally permissible in planning terms. This regularly happens where such multiple uses can occur simultaneously. In assessing the uses, Council gives consideration to the compatibility to ensure there is no unreasonable impact on adjacent activities."

8.1 Petition regarding Drainage Installation Issues on Francis Close, Kooralbyn

Cr Jennifer Sanders tabled a petition from Mark Braidwood, with 16 signatures, as follows:

"Petition to Scenic Rim Council: Request for Drainage Installation on Francis Close, Kooralbyn.

We, the undersigned residents of Francis Close, Kooralbyn, request urgent attention to the ongoing issue of water and silt runoff on our street due to the lack of proper drainage infrastructure.

Our street features a significant decline down a hill, leading to excessive water and silt flow during rain. The absence of roadside drainage has caused substantial problems, including:

Flooding of properties, with one residence experiencing two flood incidents just last week.

Blocked drains on private properties due to silt buildup, leading to maintenance issues and potential long-term damage .

Erosion and environmental concerns impacting the usability and safety of our properties.

It is evident that nearby streets with proper drainage infrastructure do not face these challenges. The lack of similar provisions on our street raises concerns about equity and effective planning in infrastructure management.

We respectfully urge the Scenic Rim Council to:

Assess the drainage needs of Francis Close, Kooralbyn.

Plan and implement appropriate drainage solutions to prevent further damage to properties and mitigate environmental concerns.

Below, you will find the signatures of affected residents, representing the shared concern and collective agreement on the urgency of this issue."

At the Ordinary Meeting held on 18 December 2024, in reference to page 81 of the Agenda of the Ordinary Meeting (Item 11.6, Attachment 1, page 1 of 11) and the reasons given for "Operating expenditure: \$0.230 million 0.6% higher than budgeted expectations", Cr Stephen Moriarty noted that "three out of the four reasons given show that the operating expenditure is less and the total of those items is \$2 million, whereas the total of the higher items is \$348,000, which would actually suggest that operating expenditure is less than budgeted not higher and I know they are only examples but I was just wondering if a Council officer ... would be able to provide some reasoning for that".
