#### **Previous Council Considerations / Resolutions**

#### Report / Background

The purpose of Council's Community Grants Program is to support local not-for-profit community groups and organisations that make a positive contribution to the quality of life in the Scenic Rim.

The program is delivered through two streams:

- Minor Community Grants up to \$5,000.
- Major Community Grants up to \$20,000.

This report provides an update on applications received for Round One of the 2025-2026 program.

Applications for Round One opened on 10 July 2025 and closed on 8 August 2025. The program was promoted via Council's website, online platforms, and direct email reminders to local community groups. In addition, Council delivered face-to-face and online information sessions to support potential applicants, with Council Officers also available for one-on-one discussions. Feedback indicates that these opportunities continue to be highly valued by community groups, often resulting in stronger applications.

In total, 15 eligible Major applications (seeking \$212,594.72) and 34 eligible Minor applications (seeking \$117,337.22) were received.

All applications were assessed through Council's standard process, with each submission evaluated against the same assessment criteria by the Grants Assessment Panel. Final recommendations are based on each application meeting the criteria outlined in the Community Grants Program Guidelines and demonstrating clear broad community benefit.

#### **Budget / Financial Implications**

Council has allocated \$400,000.00 to the Scenic Rim Community Grants Program in 2025-2026. This report proposes \$243,262.39 (\$157,873.00 for Majors and \$85,389.39 for Minors) for Round One, leaving a balance of \$156,737.61 for Round Two Minor Grants and Council's In-Kind Grant program.
