 - (i) The Queensland and Australian Governments have identified the proponent as the preferred recipient of grant funding following an open application process;
 - (ii) The development supports the designation in the Queensland Government's Shaping Queensland of the Bromelton State Development Area as a potential Recycling Enterprise Precinct; and
 - (iii) The development supports the Scenic Rim Regional Council Corporate Plan Outcome 3.1: Economic growth and employment opportunities are created through promoting and developing the region's competitive strengths in particular through promoting and advocating for the Bromelton State Development Area;
4. Council resolve that the disposal is otherwise in accordance with the sound contracting principles for the following reasons:
 - (i) Council has obtained a valuation from a valuer registered under the *Valuers Registration Act 1992*;
 - (ii) The project is to be partially funded by grants from the Australian and Queensland Governments which other businesses were able to apply for;
 - (iii) The development will be required to demonstrate compliance with all relevant national, state and local environmental legislation;
 - (iv) All Councillors and Council Officers adhere to Council's Codes of Conduct and Council's governance processes have been followed; and
5. Council delegate authority to the Chief Executive Officer, in accordance with section 257(1) of the *Local Government Act 2009*, to finalise and execute a sale agreement to either the State of Queensland or the proponent on terms satisfactory to the Chief Executive Officer.
